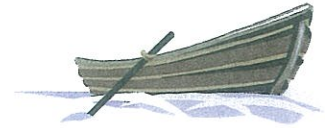

Reginald was born January 28th, 1928 in Little Deer Isle to Maynard and Lillian Sewall. He had one sister, Genivive.

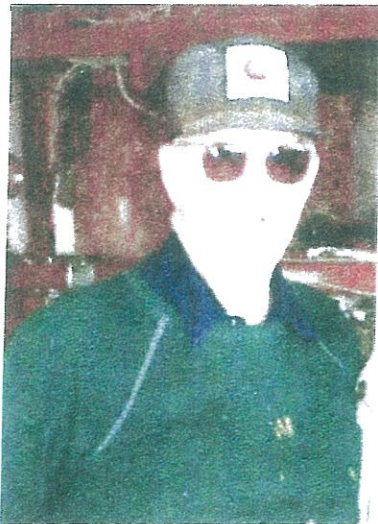
Reginald was always working. After he turned 18, he enlisted in the army but didn't see any war time. He was a clam digger and a lobsterman. He was also a Mason.

Elwyn was born February 3rd, 1924 in Stonington to Lawrence and Dorothy. After attending school, he enlisted in the Army. He served with the 787th Air Material Squadron in Louisiana where he met Willie Marie Guidry. They were married on October 15th, 1944. In 1946, Elwyn along with his wife and their son, Larry, packed up and moved back to Stonington. He served a three year apprenticeship and worked as a master stone cutter for 10 years on Crotch Island. They had a daughter, Marie.

After Crotch Island he decided to buy his first boat which he named the "Larry and Marie". In the early 60's he got a new boat and named it the "Willie Marie". He fished this boat until 1973 and then he sold it. For a short while he did some carpentry work but soon realized he would rather go fishing so he bought a smaller boat and fished that for a while. After that he gave it up for good and finished out his working years at Billings Diesel as a finished ship carpenter.

Elwyn was a lobster fisherman for over 25 years and after retiring from Billings Diesel, he spent his spare time working in the shop, barbecuing and enjoying dancing with his wife. Elwyn was very much for the community by being a volunteer fireman and an ambulance driver. He was also on the school board, as well as a member of the American Legion Post 102 and Marine Lodge No. 122.

Along with his wife and two children, they had two grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

On April 22nd, 1998, Elwyn lost his 4 year battle with cancer.
